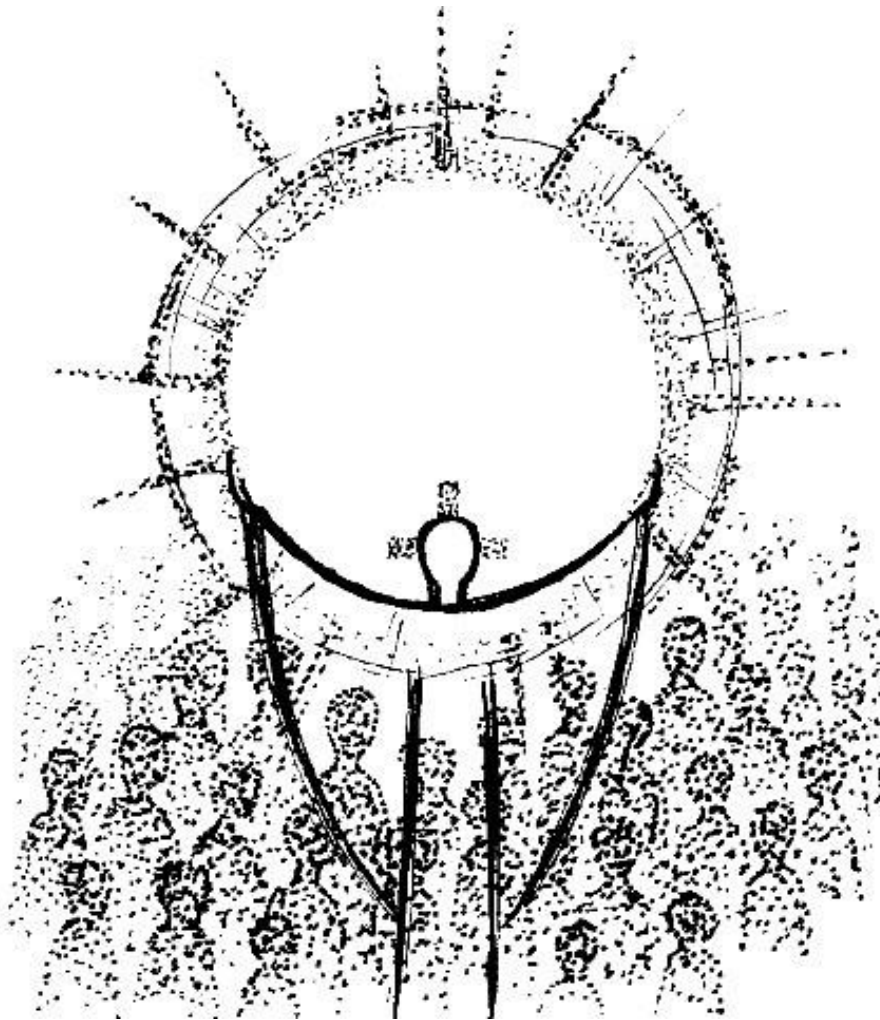

## ABOUT THIS SERVICE

Welcome to **St Margaret's Lee** and to this Eucharist.

In this Eucharist we recall the last meal of Christ with his friends in the Upper Room, and we recognise him in the breaking of the bread. Although our faith is grounded in history, this service is not a nostalgic looking back to the events of the past: it is a celebration that in the Eucharist Christ is truly present to us now, and a promise of the glory that will be ours when the whole universe is made complete in him.

The service falls into four major sections:

**The Gathering**, in which we come together as God's people, and prepare in penitence and joy to receive Christ in Word and Sacrament;

**The Liturgy of the Word**, in which we listen to the words of Scripture (culminating in the reading of the Gospel), explore the faith through the sermon and the Creed, and bring our prayers to God;

**The Liturgy of the Sacrament**, in which bread and wine are blessed in remembrance of Christ's death and resurrection, linking his sacrifice on the cross with our offering of prayer and praise, and transforming the elements of bread and wine into our spiritual food, food we are invited to share in Holy Communion;

**The Dismissal**, in which we are sent out to be the Body of Christ in the world.

## **The Greeting**

*The president greets the people*

Grace, mercy and peace  
from God our Father  
and the Lord Jesus Christ  
be with you

**All and also with you.**

*We say together:*

**We have come together as the family of God  
in our Father's presence  
to offer him praise and thanksgiving,  
to hear and receive his holy word,  
to bring before him the needs of the world,  
to ask his forgiveness of our sins, and to seek his grace,  
that through his Son Jesus Christ we may give  
ourselves to his service.  
Amen.**

## Prayers of Penitence

*The deacon invites the people to confess their sins using these or other suitable words*

God so loved the world  
that he gave his only Son Jesus Christ  
to save us from our sins,  
to be our advocate in heaven,  
and to bring us to eternal life.

Let us confess our sins in penitence and faith,  
firmly resolved to keep God's commandments  
and to live in love and peace with all.

**All** Almighty God,  
**our heavenly Father,**  
**we have sinned against you, through our own fault,**  
**in thought and word and deed,**  
**and in what we have left undone.**  
**For your Son our Lord Jesus Christ's sake,**  
**forgive us all that is past;**  
**and grant that we may serve you in newness of life**  
**to the glory of your name. Amen.**

*The president says*

May God who loved the world so much  
that he sent his Son to be our Saviour,  
forgive us our sins  
and make us holy to serve him in the world,  
through Jesus Christ our Lord.  
**All Amen.**



*The Gloria is sung by the choir*

*Glory to God in the highest,  
and on earth peace to people on earth.  
Lord God, Heavenly King,  
almighty God and Father,  
we worship you, we give you thanks,  
we praise you for your glory.  
Lord Jesus Christ, Only Son of the Father,  
Lord God Lamb of God,  
you take away the sin of the world,  
have mercy on us;  
you are seated at the right hand of the Father,  
receive our prayer.  
For you alone are the Holy One,  
you alone are the Lord,  
you alone are the Most High,  
Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit,  
in the glory of God the Father. Amen.*

**The Liturgy of the Word**

**First Reading**

**2 Timothy 4. 5-17 NRSV**

A reading from the Second Letter to Timothy

As for you, always be sober, endure suffering, do the work of an evangelist, carry out your ministry fully. As for me, I am already being poured out as a libation, and the time of my departure has come. I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith. From now on there is reserved for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, will give me on that day, and not only to me but also to all who have longed for his appearing. Do your best to come to me soon, for Demas, in love with this present world, has deserted me and gone to Thessalonica; Crescens has gone to Galatia, Titus to Dalmatia. Only Luke is with me. Get Mark and bring him with you, for he is useful in my ministry. I have sent Tychicus to Ephesus. When you come, bring the cloak that I left with Carpus at Troas, also the books, and above all the parchments. Alexander the coppersmith did me great harm; the Lord will pay him back for his deeds. You also must beware of him, for he strongly opposed our message. At my first defence no one came to my support, but all deserted me. May it not be counted against them! But the Lord stood by me and gave me strength, so that through me the message might be fully proclaimed and all the Gentiles might hear it. So I was rescued from the lion's mouth.

This is the word of the Lord.

**Gospel Reading**

**Luke 10. 1-9 NRSV**

*The following or another suitable acclamation heralds the Gospel reading.*

Alleluia, alleluia.

I am the first and the last says the Lord and the living one.

I was dead and behold I am alive for evermore.

**All Alleluia.**

*The reader says*

The Lord be with you

**All and also with you.**

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke

**All Glory to you, O Lord.**

After this the Lord appointed seventy others and sent them on ahead of him in pairs to every town and place where he himself intended to go. He said to them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the labourers are few; therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out labourers into his harvest. Go on your way. See, I am sending you out like lambs into the midst of wolves. Carry no purse, no bag, no sandals; and greet no one on the road. Whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace to this house!' And if anyone is there who shares in peace, your peace will rest on that person; but if not, it will return to you. Remain in the same house, eating and drinking whatever they provide, for the labourer deserves to be paid. Do not move about from house to house. Whenever you enter a town and its people welcome you, eat what is set before you; cure the sick who are there, and say to them, 'The kingdom of God has come near to you.'

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Let us offer one another a sign of peace.

*All exchange the BSL sign of peace.*

## The Eucharistic Prayer

*The president takes the bread and says*

With this bread that we bring  
**All we shall remember Jesus.**

*The president takes the wine and says*

With this wine that we bring  
**All we shall remember Jesus.**

Bread for his body,  
wine for his blood,  
gifts from God to his table we bring.  
**All we shall remember Jesus.**

*The Congregation hold up the bread (and wine) they have brought to church*

Lord God, source of all holiness,  
Breathe your spirit upon your people

And upon this bread and wine,  
That they may become for us your body and your blood.

For on the night before he died,  
Gathered round the table with his friends,  
Jesus took bread, blessed it, broke it  
and said: "Take, eat, this is my body given for you.  
Do this in remembrance of me".

In the same way he took the cup of wine, blessed it  
and said: "Drink this all of you,  
This is my blood which is shed for you.  
Take and share it in remembrance of me."

And as the bread and wine which we now eat and drink,  
Are changed into us,  
may we be changed again into you.

Bone of your bone,  
Flesh of your flesh,  
Loving and caring in the world.

*The Choir sing the Sanctus & Benedictus:*

We break this bread to share in the Body of Christ

**All** **Though we are many, we are one body, because we all share in one bread.**
