## **ERNEST MILLS CARTWRIGHT**

Birth:

He was the grandson of William Matthews (D: 1874) and Mary Ann Matthews (D: 1881) who are buried in St Margaret's Old Churchyard (N0 259)

He was the son of Charles Knight Cartwright and Jane Burford Cartwright of Bromley. She became Mrs Mallett of 8 Cambridge Rd, Bromley, Kent.

Second Lieutenant, CARTWRIGHT, ERNEST MILLS. Ernest enlisted in 1916 into the 11th Battalion of the Tank Corps. Died 13/04/1918, Aged 38. CHOCQUES MILITARY CEMETERY [III. C. 3] (France).

## Inspiration?

One wonders if Ernest was inspired to go join the Tank corps by the strong presence of Tank Corps legends living on the Greenwich side of the Heath.

These included Colonel Francis Edward Swinton KCB CB DSO the inspiration and driving force behind the "armoured tractor". He lived at 1 Annersley Rd. Major General Sir Hugh Ellis the Commander of the Turks at Cambrai who lived at No 4 and Robert Blair Swinton
