Birth -abt 1877

He was married to Catherine and they had three children Hattie Annie, Charles Edward and John Walter.

In 1911 he lived in 52 Ferrier St, Wandsworth and he was a Plumber. In 1913 he was still in Wandsworth but had moved to 116 Ingreve Rd.

Arthur was a Private in the RAMC and was awarded a British War Medal and a Victory Medal. Possibly died in 1920?

**We think -** He was the son of Mr and Mrs W.F. Parris. They lived at 66 Murillo Road.

His father W.F.Parris became a Server in April 1913 and he was the Honorary Secretary and Treasurer for the Men's Socials. Mrs Parris was involved in collecting the money for a memorial to Miss Williams which is the Sanctuary Lamp that hangs in the Chancel.

In 1923 Mr Parris was the treasurer as the church struggled to raise money to pay for repairs.
