Birth: 1885 in Edmonton.

He was the elder son of Charles Hooper, stationer, and Edith Mary of 8 Aberdeen Terrace, Blackheath. His younger brothers Colin and Bernard are mentioned above.

Charles was married to Gladys Mary (Allen) and they lived at 33 Quentin Road.

2nd Lieutenant HOOPER, CHARLES GORDON 20th Battalion, The London Regiment. He was Discharged due to Sickness 3rd August 1916.

War Service:

An Article in the London Gazette on the 30th April 1909 states that Charles has been given the rank of 2nd Lieutenant in the 20th Battalion (Blackheath and Woolwich) of the London Regiment

The resignation of Charles G. Hooper appeared in the London Gazette of the 28th January 1913, only to be cancelled in April 1913.

On the 17th August 1915 Charles was subjected to a Court Martial at Woolwich.
