

W. G. P. PINNIGAR. MC

Birth:

He was the son of William Pennegar, a coachman.

He lived in 5 Kingswood Place. He was a chorister and a bell-ringer.

He enlisted as a Private the Royal Field Artillery (36893) and was  
later a 2nd Lieutenant in their Machine Gun Corps

Died 4th October 1917

In the Gazette of 11.01.1918 he was Gazetted :-

“Awarded to W Pinnigar for gallantry and devotion to duty when under fire the Military Cross”

This refers to an incident in 17.07.1916.

He was also able to wear the “Wounded Stripe”
